Reminder: By **April 24, 2026**, all of your digital course content should meet accessibility standards in compliance with the Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) new rule. This includes all instructional materials you share through **Canvas and other platforms**, for **both online and face-to-face courses**.

As you work diligently to make your course materials accessible, check out our MyCEHD Accessibility Resources webpage. It is designed to be your convenient digital accessibility go-to guide. - Generate your course accessibility score in Canvas and address any issues with course elements.
- 2. Ensure **images** have appropriate alternative (alt) text.

- 5. Make your **PDFs** accessible.
- 6. Provide accurate **captions** for all video content.

 copy over only the content you need. This approach not only improves the accuracy of your
 accessibility scores but makes remediating any issues more efficient.

JUST GETTING STARTED WITH DIGITAL ACCESSIBILITY?

Making your course materials accessible doesn't have to feel overwhelming. Here are a few steps and quick tips to guide you:

- 1. Delete any old material from your Canvas course that you won't be using.
- 2. Add <u>alternative (alt) text</u> descriptions to images in <u>Canvas</u> and <u>Microsoft documents</u>.
- 3. Review and remediate Word documents using the <u>accessibility checker in MS Word</u>. *Tip:* Ensure you're using the latest version of Office 365.
- 4. Review and remediate PowerPoint presentations.
- 5. Make your <u>PDFs</u> accessible. If you have the source document, remediate in <u>Word</u> or <u>PowerPoint</u>. If you don't have the source document, remediate in <u>Adobe</u> Acrobat.
- 6. Add <u>captions</u> to videos <u>Using audio transcription cloud recordings [Zoom]</u>, <u>Add closed captions to a video [Camtasia]</u>.

7.	Reach out for support! Take advantage of the many resources available.
